

You would never shout out your private business from the street corner. So keep private things to yourself online.

Never give out your...


Full name, address, school, age, date of birth or passwords and always use privacy settings if you have a social network page – keep it **zipped**, it's private.

You do not have to put up with unkind people. So use your computer to **block** any nasty messages or pictures and strange attachments or links.

You should always tell someone you trust about a bully on the playground.

So **flag** it up if you are upset online or if somebody you've never met asks to meet you. Never ever meet up without taking an adult with you - it's dangerous. Always tell your teacher or an adult you trust about anything that makes you feel uncomfortable.


Look out for the "Report Abuse" button and use it if you need to. It will take you through to web pages that give good advice and lets you tell the Police.
