Outcomes

The school was highly successful in sporting events and won 13 Level 2 local events. We sent 47 children to Level 3 School Games Events.

As part of the success, additional coaching was secured from the SSP.

A number of children were involved in Sports Leadership as Ambassadors and developed and managed intra-school events including football and dodgeball.

Many children represented the school at Level 2 events for the first time this year due to increased opportunities.

Most children say that they enjoy PE and can see the benefits of the lesson thus promoting a positive ethos to health and physical activity in the school.
